Take the metro from Polytechnique (Universite de Montreal metro station). Take the Blue line to Snowdon Station. Take the Orange line to Place d'Armes Station. Exit on Saint-Urbain Street and walk uphill toward Place D'Armes Square.

How to get there: From Place D'armes square, walk through Notre-dame Street toward west direction. You can find different souvenir shops and restaurants in this area.

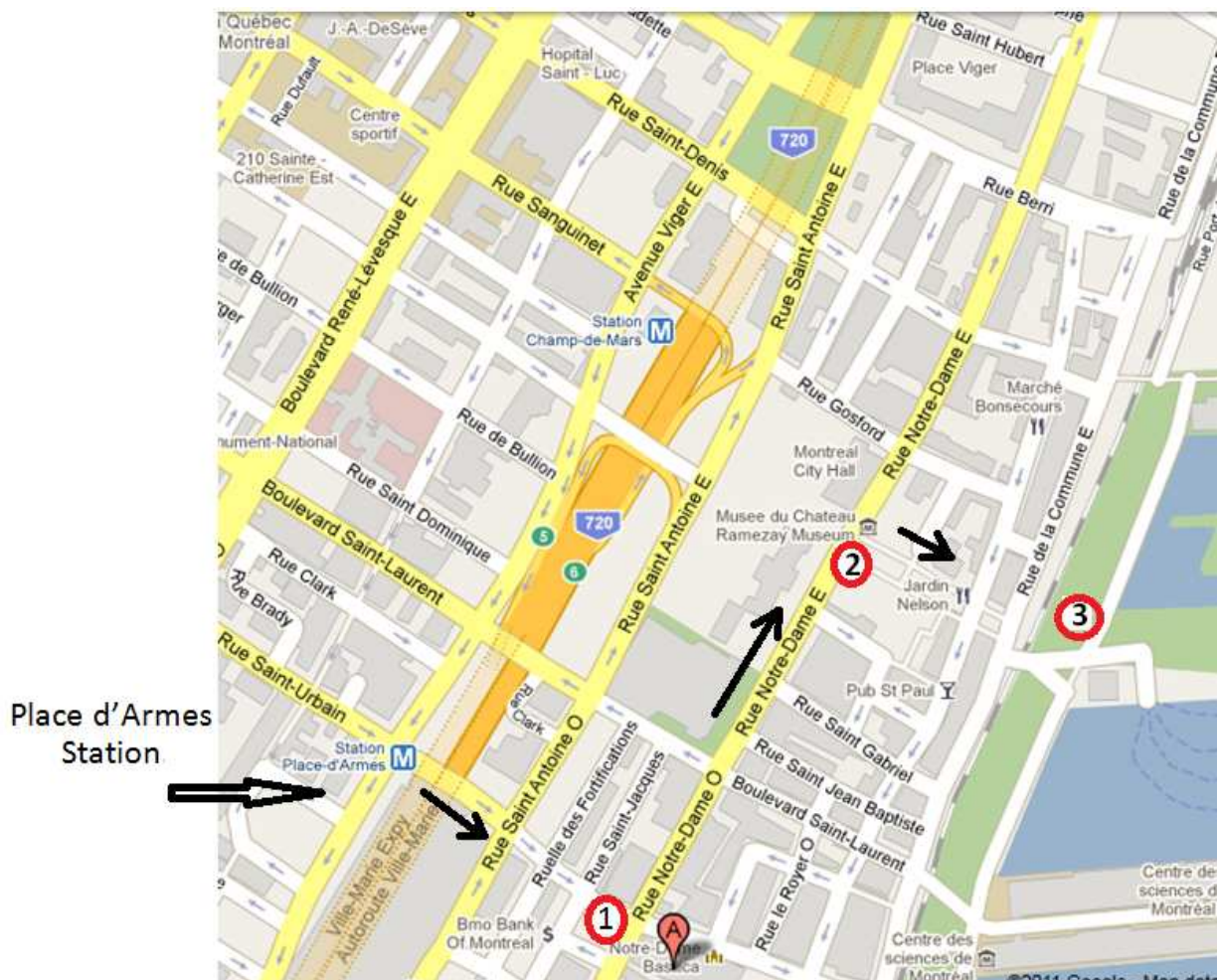
This street hosts many street artists, kiosks and different restaurants.
